Curriculum

What are students expected to learn this year:

English: In third-grade English and writing, children can build on foundational language skills while developing more advanced reading comprehension and writing abilities. Students will engage with various texts to enhance vocabulary, understanding of grammar, and critical thinking. Writing assignments will focus on improving sentence structure, coherence, and creativity, encouraging students to express their ideas clearly and effectively. Through these activities, students will gain confidence in their reading and writing skills, preparing them for more complex language tasks.

Math: In third-grade math, children can deepen their understanding of essential mathematical concepts, including multiplication, division, fractions, and basic geometry. Students will engage in problem-solving activities that encourage logical thinking and the application of math skills in real-life situations. The curriculum will also focus on developing fluency with numbers, particularly in addition, subtraction, and multiplication

facts. By the end of the year, students will have a stronger foundation in math, preparing them for more advanced concepts in the coming grades.

*Students will be tested 3X's a year along with a diagnostic test to monitor their process

Religion: Students will attend Mass weekly on Fridays unless otherwise specified. Active participation in Mass is expected, and students will also have monthly reconciliation opportunities.

Science: This year, we will utilize the Mystery Science program, aligning with the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). Our curriculum will cover key topics including "Animals Through Time," "The Circle of Life," "The Fate of Traits," and "Stormy Skies," providing students with a comprehensive and engaging science education.

Social Studies: In third grade, students learn about how people and events from the past have shaped the world we live in today. They explore how local, regional, and national governments and traditions have grown and how they influence our lives. The focus is on California's physical and cultural history, including learning about American Indians, the arrival of immigrants, and how these groups have helped shape our community and society.

*This year students will be taking the STAR examination once every trimester. They will also be taking the ARK region test.

Class Expectations

Class Rules:

Class Work and Homework Policy:

Homework will be given on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Students will also be given spelling words and vocabulary words on Mondays, and they will be tested on Friday at the end of the week.

Absence work is expected to be completed and submitted by the end of the week. While late work may be accepted depending on individual circumstances, students must communicate any challenges they face. Additionally, there will be a designated area in the classroom for "no name" work. Students are encouraged to regularly check this section to ensure their work is properly credited.

Discipline: Discipline in our classroom begins with open communication with the student, focusing on understanding the behavior and guiding them towards making better choices. Consequences will be appropriate and proportional to the situation, aimed at helping the student learn from their actions. If the behavior persists or is serious, parents will be contacted as a last resort to work together in supporting the student's growth and development.
