Dear 5th and 6th Grade Parents:

Welcome Back! My name is Ms. Sanchez, I am the 5th and 6th grade teacher (Room 5). I have been part of the Santa Rosa de Lima School for the last 23 years, and this is my 5th year teaching a multi-age classroom. It is my deepest aspiration that we will support and guide each other in a way that will provide a warm and secure environment where maximal learning can take place.

Mission Statement:

School Learning Expectations:

Students at Santa Rosa are:

Welcoming, Academic, Responsible, Religious, Innovative, Optimistic, Self-Aware

Since lifelong success depends in part on learning to make responsible choices. I have developed a classroom discipline plan, which guides every student to make good decisions about his or her behavior. Your child deserves the most positive educational climate possible for his/her growth, and I know that together we will make a difference in this process. The plan below outlines our rules, positive recognition for appropriate behavior and consequences for inappropriate behavior. They are:

Class Rules:

1. Follow directions
2. Respect “EVERYONE” including the teacher
3. Keep your hands and feet to yourself
4. Raise your hand and wait for your turn to speak
5. Listen carefully while the teacher is talking

Positive Recognition:

To encourage students to follow these rules, I will recognize appropriate behavior with praise “Class Points” in the ClassDojo app. Students who receive only positive points throughout the week will receive a “treat or prize” on Friday.

Consequences:

There will be consequences for those students who break the rules.

1. First warning
2. Second warning
3. Points taken away from ClassDojo
4. Email to parents/Phone call to parents
5. Teacher/Parent Conference

Homework:

1. All students will write their homework assignment for that day on their agendas/iPads.
2. I will assign homework Monday through Thursday nights. If a student is absent or has missing assignments, he/she must complete them over the weekend since all weekly assignments will be archived on Monday.
3. Students will have to complete a weekly goal for ELA and Math on iReady.
4. All assignments **MUST** be submitted on time and fully completed in order to receive full credit.
5. All daily assignments will be posted on ClassDojo.
6. Make sure to sit with your child and go over his/her homework. Have your child show you the work so you can check it off in the agenda/iPad.
7. If homework is incomplete or not done then... You will receive a notification on the ClassDojo app and it will also be reflected on your child's grades Friday when I publish the grades on **Gradelink** .
8. Academic integrity of work submission is very important. Any student who plagiarizes the work of another student or the internet will received a "0" as his/her grade.
9. Homework will be posted daily on **ClassDojo** after school.
10. This is an opportunity for you to be involved in your child's education, as well as being aware of your child's progress in school, please check **Gradelink** in a regular basis. Grades will be published every Friday.

Daily Reading at Home:

Students will not be provided with a reading log. However, I expect them to read daily at home at least for 20 minutes.

Students will be reading **THREE** core novels in class throughout the school year. For each novel read in class, there will be a special project that has to be done at home. You will get the guidelines and rubric for the project at least three weeks before the project is due. Please make sure the projects are completed on time to receive full credit for them. LATE WORK will be accepted with a 10% grade per day deduction penalty.

CURRICULUM:

Math: Place Value, Whole Numbers, Decimals, Fractions (Addition, subtraction, multiplication, division), Geometry, and Measurement, (Expressions and Equations)

Reading: Nonfiction, Realistic Fiction, Fiction, Informational Text, and Biographies

Writing: The Writing Process -Narrative, Informational, Opinion and Persuasive - Parts of Speech - Sentences, Nouns, Pronouns, Verbs, Adjectives, and Adverbs

Religion: Gospel studies, Feast Days and Grade Level Prayers

History: US History - Native Americans, Explorers, The 13 Colonies, Causes of the American Revolution and the Great Expansion

Science: The Scientific Method - Physical Science -Matter -Life Science -Classification of Plants and Animals, and -Earth-Space Science -The Planets

Testing Throughout the School-Year:

Students will be tested throughout the school year in the following areas:

STAR Testing (Both grades 3 times a year -August, January and May)

iReady Diagnostic (Both grades 3 times a year -August, January and May)

ACRE Religion Test - ONLY 5th grade in December

ARK Religion Test - Both grades in May

Tests and Projects:

Students will be doing projects both at home and in class. You will get the information at least three weeks in advanced before the projects are due.

Students will receive a study guide prior to the test. It is your child's responsibility to take notes during class time and study for the test.

All tests dates will be posted on the Weekly Newsletter in order for you to check your child's study habits.

The grading scale for the six core subjects (Math, Reading, ELA, Religion, History and Science) is as follows:

Art is a Credit/NoCredit subject.

PE and Music will be graded by their teachers.
